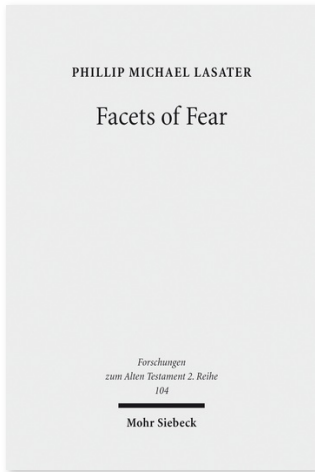

How was this notion applied, and what taxonomical challenges does it involve?
