Sara Contini untersucht einen Brennpunkt in der Geschichte der Idee der universellen Menschenwürde. Sie zeigt, dass lateinische Autoren des 4. Jahrhunderts darin eine zentrale Rolle spielten, indem sie zwischen dem traditionellen römischen Begriff der *dignitas* und den griechisch-christlichen Ansichten über den als Ebenbild Gottes geschaffenen Menschen vermittelten.

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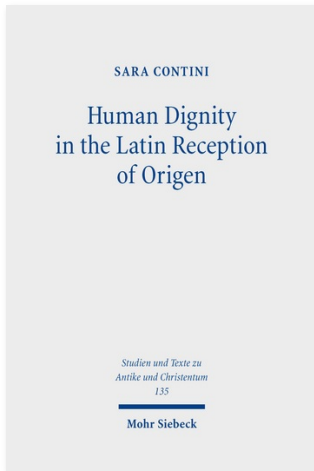
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
