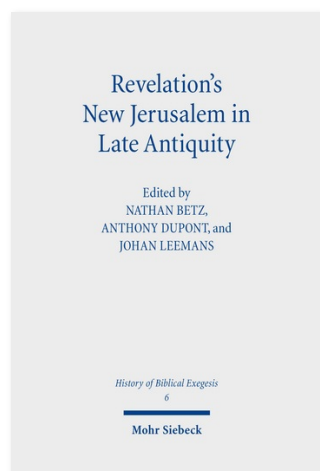


Revelation's New Jerusalem in Late Antiquity
