Das Princeton-Projekt zu den Schriftenrollen vom Toten Meer bietet eine kritische Ausgabe aller Qumran-Dokumente mit Ausnahme der Bibelhandschriften. Der vorliegende Ergänzungsband bietet die Erstausgaben von sechs bisher nicht untersuchten Manuskripten aus der jüdischen Wüste, welche Texte aus der Tora (Levitikus, Deuteronomium), den Prophetenbüchern (Jeremia) und den Schriften (Daniel) enthält.

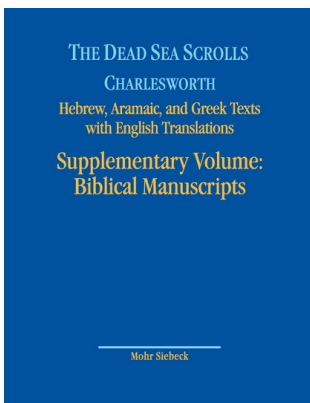
