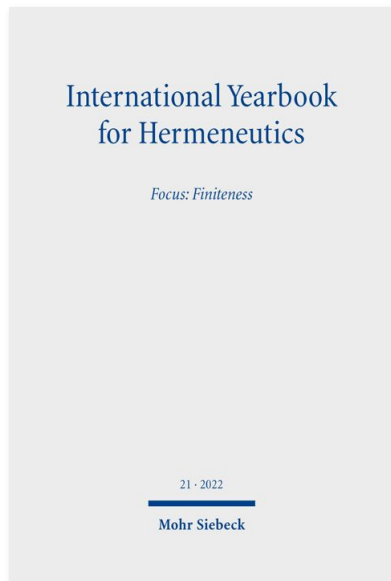

**Gert-Jan van der Heiden** Born 1976; 2003 PhD in Mathematics; 2008 PhD in Philosophy; since 2017 Chair of the Department of Metaphysics and Philosophical Anthropology, Radboud University of Nijmegen.

**Anna Novokhatko** Born 1978; 2004 PhD; 2018 Habilitation; since 2020 Associate Professor of Classical Philology at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki.
