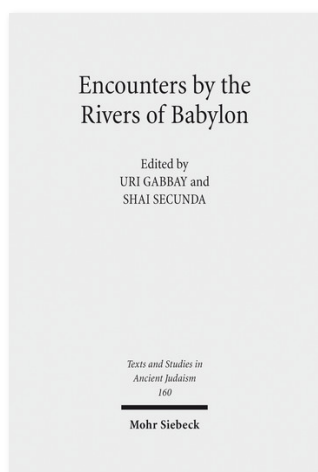


Encounters by the Rivers of Babylon
